Management Plan Amendment **March 2025**

1.0 Context

This document outlines a zoning plan change for Nancy Greene Park which was set out in the Purpose Statement and Zoning Plan (the management plan) approved in 2003. The amendment to the Intensive Recreation Zone area was completed so camping can be separated from day use facilities. Moving camping to a different area of the park will alleviate existing use challenges and better serve user demand.

2.0 Rationale and Recommended Amendment

Nancy Greene Park's overnight facilities are currently limited to 12 campsites located around the day use parking lot. Conflicts occur periodically between overnight and day users because of shared use of the parking lot and adjacent facilities (e.g., picnic tables and fire rings).

The management plan identifies that the "existing facilities do not meet the high demand for day use and camping opportunities at this popular site" and the accompanying strategy for addressing that issue is to "consider options for developing a 25-unit campground and upgraded day use area".

BC Parks conducted feasibility studies, including archaeology and conservation assessments, to identify the most appropriate location and number of sites for a new campground. The preferred location for the campground expansion that best meets recreation objectives, avoids cultural heritage features, and minimizes impacts to conservation values is located outside the current "Intensive Recreation Zone" in the management plan.

BC Parks is amending the management plan to allow for campground relocation and expansion by reconfiguring the Intensive Recreation Zone and associated Management Response as shown below.

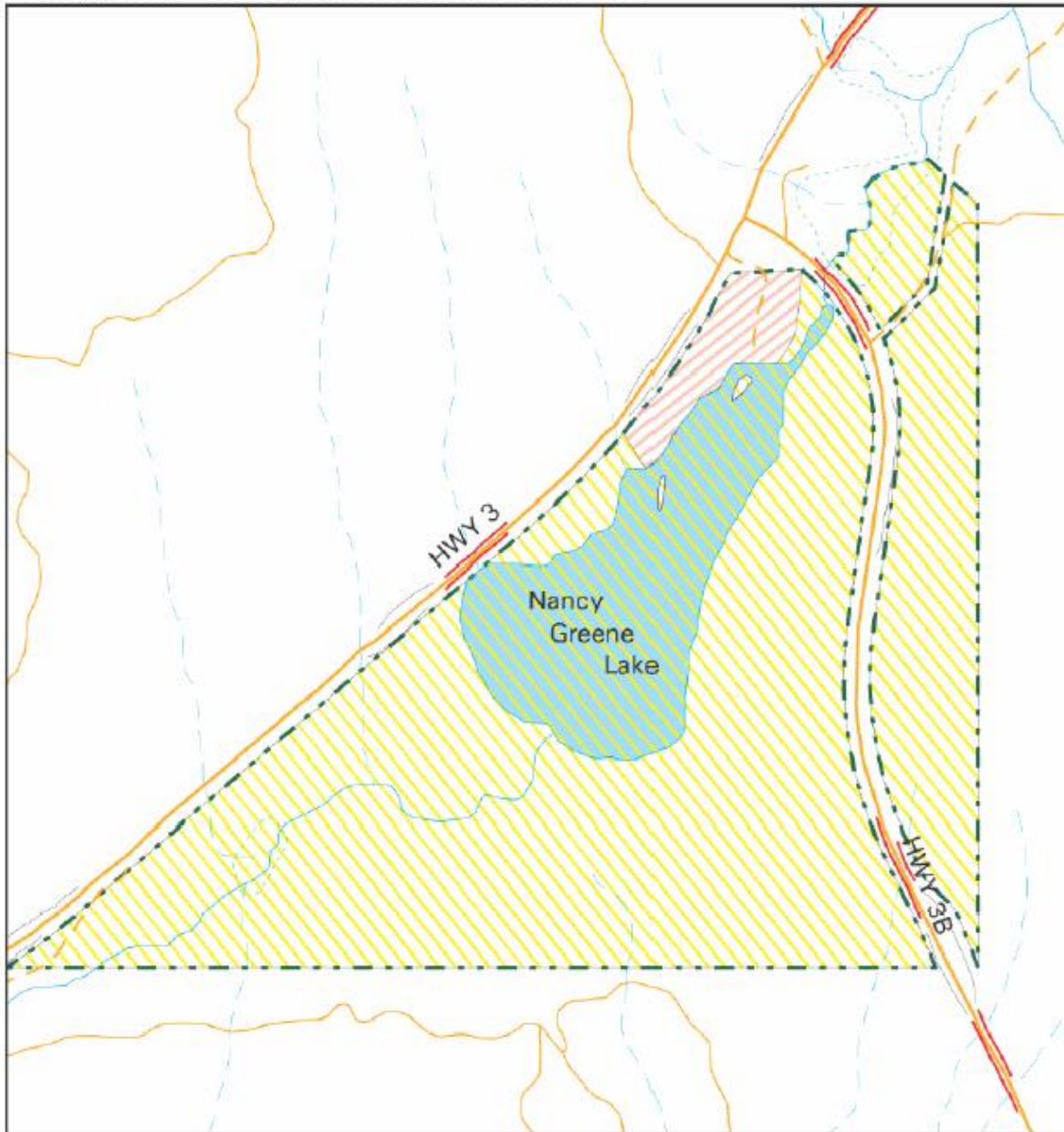
Amendments: Known Management Issues/Response and Zoning

"Existing day use and camping facilities located together north of the lake do not meet the high demand at this popular site."	"Relocate all camping facilities to the east side of the lake, which will allow space for additional campsites. Upgrade the existing day use facilities north of the lake."
