Have you ever considered becoming a citizen scientist?  **iNaturalist**
With the iNaturalist app, you can!

What: Identify wildlife and plants, learn fun facts about the organisms all around you, and help scientists learn more about the living things in parks!

How: Use the iNaturalist app to photograph and share the biodiversity you see in BC Parks and protected areas! You have to be 13 years or older to use the app.

iNaturalist also has an app called Seek that you can use without an account. Seek lets you learn more about the living things you see.

Where: Look for iNaturalist or Seek by iNaturalist in any App Store.
