#### CANIM BEACH PARK Purpose Statement and Zoning Plan

Canim Beach Park was established on March 15, 1956. The park is 8.2 hectares in area and situated 43 kilometres east of 100 Mile House.

### **Primary Role**

The **primary** role of Canim Beach Park is to provide recreational lakeshore access with day use and camping opportunities for local residents.

Known Management Issues	Response
Aging deciduous trees may form hazard to users.	Complete annual hazard tree assessments.
Low utilization of campground and high operations costs	One of 46 parks identified in the ministry's 2002 Service Withdrawal initiative. Consider working with the Treaty Negotiation Office to offer operations of park or entire property as part of Treaty.

#### Zoning

The entire park (8.2 hectares) is zoned Intensive Recreation.

Wells Gray, Cariboo Mountains and Bowron Lake parks are the major contributors to the representation of this ecosection.		
• biogeoclimatic subzone/variant		Canin Beach's contribution to ecosystem representation is negligible due its small size (8.2 hectares). Situated in the poorly represented IDFmw2. 4.08% of this variant is currently protected, primarily in Dunn Peak Protected Area and Wells Gray Park.
