

**CHRISTINA LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK
Purpose Statement and Zoning Plan**

Christina Lake Provincial Park is a 6 hectare area located on the south end of the lake near Highway 3 in the town of Christina Lake.

The **primary purpose** of the park is to provide lake-oriented outdoor recreation activities.

The park is the main provider of swimming, beach-activity and picnicking opportunities for local residents and many of the tourists using the nearby accommodation.

The **secondary purpose** of the park is to protect 350 metres of sand beach and a small fir/cedar stand. Much of the remainder of the park has been developed for parking and grass area.

The park is in the Selkirk Foothills and Southern Okanagan Highland ecosections and has IDHdw and IDFxh1 biogeoclimatic subzone/variants but contributes little because of its small size and level of development. There are no known species at risk in the park.

Known Management Issues	Response
The park has limited provincial park significance but is an important day use site for locals and supports Christina Lake's tourist industry.	Investigate the potential transfer of the park to a local interest.

Zoning

The entire park (6 hectares) is zoned Intensive Recreation to provide lake-oriented recreation opportunities.
