### COMOX LAKE BLUFFS ECOLOGICAL RESERVE Purpose Statement

Ecological reserves are areas selected to preserve representative and special natural ecosystems, plant and animal species, features and phenomena. The key goal of ecological reserves is to contribute to the maintenance of biological diversity and the protection of genetic materials. All consumptive resource uses and the use of motorized vehicles are prohibited. Research and educational activities may be carried out but only under permit.

#### **Primary Role**

The **primary** role of Comox Lake Bluffs Ecological Reserve is to protect a unique ecosystem and unusual botanical phenomena. The ecological reserve contains bluffs and shallow soils with an assemblage of regionally rare plants and communities. Although much of the sites has been logged, it has high levels of biodiversity with several species at the limits of their range and unusual dry open-site plant communities in the Coastal Western Hemlock zone, such as Douglas-fir (shore pine) /arbutus /manzanita /bearberry and Douglas fir (shore pine) /arbutus /Rocky Mountain juniper. The least moonwort, a blue-listed plant, is found here.
