## WINTER TRAIL REPORT

### Cypress Park

#### **SAFETY ADVISORY**

- Plan ahead – ensure you have enough time to return before dark. Visit [adventuresmart.ca](https://adventuresmart.ca).
- Carry your 10 essentials and know how to use them. Make a trip plan and let someone know where you're going and when you're expected to return.
- Unpredictable weather may occur at any time of year. Be self-sufficient and prepared for storms, poor visibility, cold temperatures and an unexpected overnight stay.
- Natural hazards such as exposed rocks, windfall, and dead standing trees may be encountered on all trails at any time - use at your own risk.
- Information regarding current avalanche hazard ratings is available through Avalanche Canada: [www.avalanche.ca](https://www.avalanche.ca).
- BC Parks does not monitor lake ice thickness – stay on marked trails.
- Select traction devices based on current conditions.

BLACK MOUNTAIN PLATEAU	  FREE AT THE BLACK MOUNTAIN LODGE	Follow the marked winter pole route from the bottom of Eagle Express Chairlift to Cabin Lake and around the Black Mountain Plateau.  <b>Expect variable snow conditions and wear the appropriate footwear and traction devices based on conditions.</b>	<div>     </div> <p>NO CAMPING within 1km of the road</p> <p>Only winter camping is permitted in the southern section of Cypress Park.</p>	<p><i>4km return to Cabin Lake + 3 km loop (optional). Access by following the Backcountry Access Corridor (BAC) to the bottom of Eagle Express Chairlift in the Alpine Ski Area.</i></p> <p>Trail to Cabin Lake is a series of steep switchbacks. Most elevation is gained on this section. The loop meanders through subalpine lakes and over to Black Mountain South Summit (1218m).</p> <p><b><u>Winter travel to Eagle Bluffs is not recommended.</u></b></p>
BOWEN LOOKOUT	  FREE AT THE BLACK MOUNTAIN LODGE	Follow the marked winter pole route through Yew Lake and on to Bowen Lookout. <i>Winter travel past Bowen Lookout is <u>not recommended</u>.</i>  <b>Expect variable snow conditions and wear the appropriate footwear and traction devices based on conditions.</b>	<div>     </div>	<p><i>3.5km return</i></p> <p><i>Access by following the Backcountry Access Corridor (BAC) to the bottom of Eagle Express Chairlift in the Alpine Ski Area.</i></p> <p>The trail is mostly flat through Yew Lake with 150m elevation gained over the last section.</p>
YEW LAKE	  FREE AT THE BLACK MOUNTAIN LODGE	Follow the marked winter pole route through Yew Lake.  <b>Expect variable snow conditions and wear the appropriate footwear and traction devices based on conditions. Take care when crossing the snow that's collected on bridged creek crossings.</b>	<div>     </div>	<p><i>2km return</i></p> <p><i>Access by following the Backcountry Access Corridor (BAC) to the bottom of Eagle Express Chairlift in the Alpine Ski Area.</i></p> <p>This trail is very short and does NOT loop in the winter season. It travels through open meadows except for the very end of the trail which takes you in the Old Growth Forest and ends at the access road.</p>
HOLLYBURN MOUNTAIN ACCESS TRAIL	<div>N/A</div>  PROCEED WITHOUT	Follow the marked winter pole route from the parking lot to the summit of Hollyburn Mountain.  <b>Expect variable snow conditions and wear the appropriate footwear and traction devices based on conditions. Final sections of the trail are steep and can be very slippery.</b>	<div>     </div> <p>NO CAMPING within 1km of the road</p> <p>Only winter camping is permitted in the southern section of Cypress Park.</p>	<p><i>6km return / 430m gain</i></p> <p><i>Trailhead located 25 m North from the BC Parks information kiosk in the Nordic Ski Area.</i></p> <p>The trail travels through second-growth forest and starts and ends with steep elevation gain. The upper section offers views of the North Shore mountains as you approach the summit of Hollyburn Mountain.</p>

## BACKCOUNTRY ACCESS CORRIDOR (BAC)

**OPEN FROM 7AM -10PM**

To ensure Cypress Resort's safe operation of maintenance activities on ski runs and in base areas, and for the safety of other resort users, people accessing Yew Lake, Bowen Lookout, or the Black Mountain Plateau are asked to follow the 'Backcountry Access Corridor' through Cypress Resort's Alpine Ski Area. It is marked by green circular markers from the Black Mountain Lodge to the trailhead beyond the Eagle Express Chairlift. Backcountry users are required to carry a free yellow BAC tag when traveling along the Backcountry Access Corridor.

1. **Get your free yellow BAC tag in the Brown Bag Room at the Black Mountain Lodge.**
2. **Go towards Cypress Creek Lodge and follow the green BAC markers to the trailhead beyond the Eagle Express Chairlift (see the map below).**



### Useful Info:



**Bathrooms are located inside the Black Mountain Lodge or Cypress Creek Lodge. Please remove traction devices and leave your poles outside.**



**Cypress Park is a smoke-free environment.**



**For your safety, DO NOT TRAVEL ON SKI RUNS. Skiers on Black Mountain Plateau who are in possession of a yellow BAC tag should descend on the Forks ski run accessed at the top of the Eagle Express Chairlift.**



**Dogs must be leashed everywhere in Cypress Park. Dogs are only permitted on the Yew Lake trail with adequate snow coverage. Respect posted signage.**

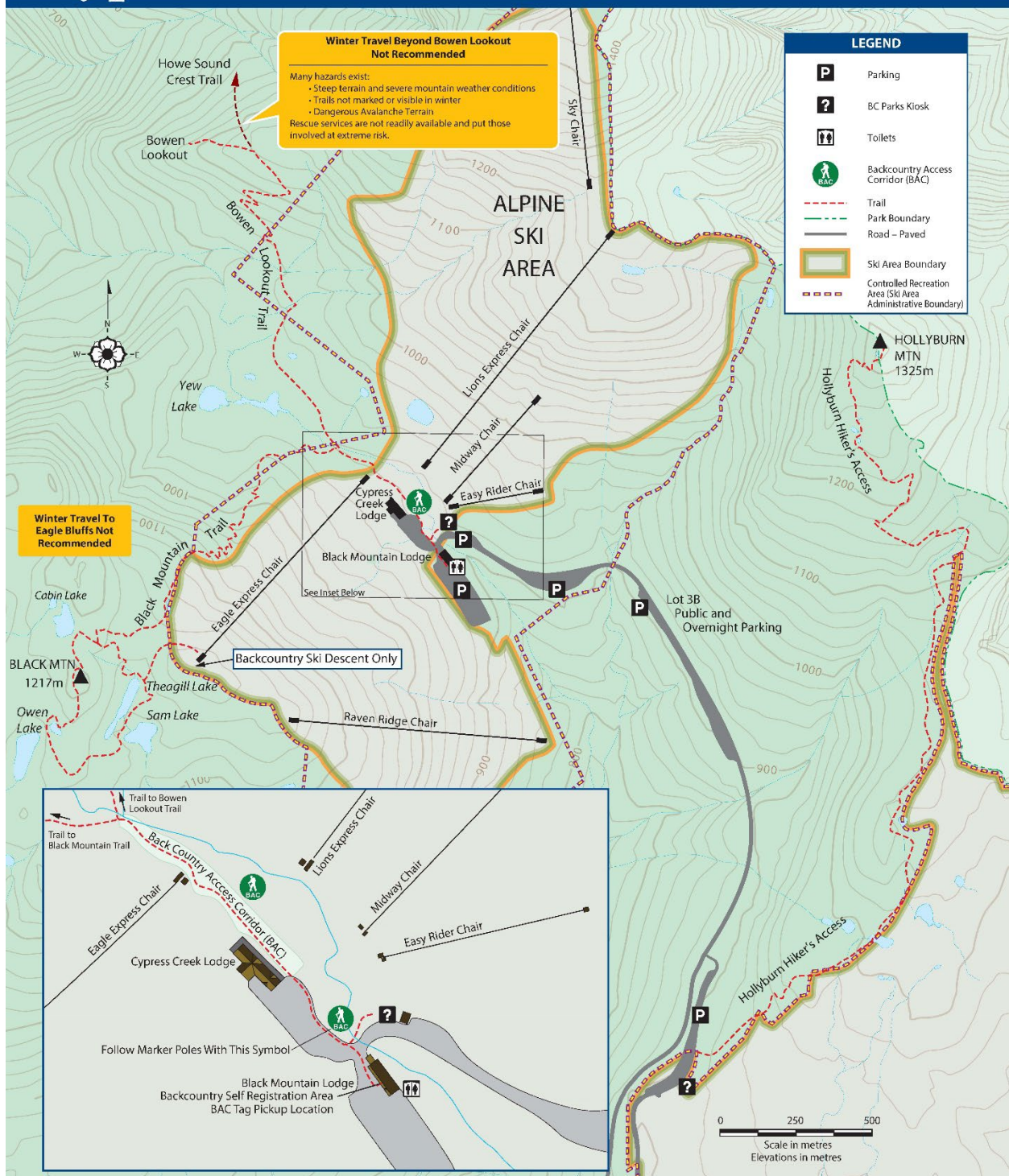
## PARKING INFO

Cypress Resort may implement paid parking for the winter season. Free parking is available in parking lot 3B and on the Nordic road shoulder between Cypress Bowl Road and the BC Parks information kiosk. When in operation, Cypress Resort offers a free shuttle service for resort and backcountry users between parking lot 3B and the Alpine and Nordic Ski Areas.

- **Overnight parking is located in parking lot 3B (see map).**
- **During weekends and holidays, the parking lots in Cypress Park can become very congested. Consider carpooling or using Cypress Coach Lines.**
