Welcome to the Park!



Dahl Lake Provincial Park provides a wilderness atmosphere within an hour of Prince George. The park has rustic picnic facilities, a sandy beach, a short walking trail, and has great canoeing and wildlife viewing opportunities.

Things to Do and See While Visiting

Inside the Park



Fishing- Dahl Lake has moderate fishing potential for rainbow trout and whitefish.

Canoeing/kayaking— A small creek connects Norman Lake to Dahl Lake. Travel south from the beach along the shoreline and follow the creek into Dahl Lake.



Swimming– The beach is located on the east side of Norman Lake. There are no lifeguards on duty.



Hiking- There is a short trail from the beach picnic area to the north shore of Dahl Lake.

What You Need to Know

Motorized boats are prohibited on Dahl Lake and the access creek.

- Pets must be on leash at all times.
- Dahl Lake Park is day-use only. Camping and fires are prohibited.
- ATV's are not permitted in the park.
- Hunting is allowed is some areas of the Park. Please check the Hunting and Trapping regulations for more information.



• Water in the park is not a potable drinking source.

• Always wear life-jackets and carry the manda-

Wildlife here include moose, black bear, wolf, and coyote. Small mammals such as fox, beaver, otter, and muskrat are also abundant. In addition to geese, ducks, and loons, other common bird species at Dahl Lake include owls, eagles, and osprey.
