KICKININEE PROVINCIAL PARKPurpose Statement and Zoning Plan

The 49 hectare Kickininee Park is located on Okanagan Lake adjacent to Highway 97 south of Summerland. The park is composed of 3 separate sites - Pyramid, Soorimpt and Kickininee.

The **primary purpose** of the park is to provide highway rest stops and lake-oriented day use recreation opportunities. The park provides picnicking, swimming, beach-oriented and boat launching opportunities. It also provides a panoramic view of the southern portion of Okanagan Lake.

The **secondary purpose** of the park is to protect its foreshore and upland features.

The park is part of the Northern Okanagan Basin Ecosection and contains BGxh1 biogeoclimatic subzone/variant. The conservation values are low due to the small size of the park and the level of facility development that has occurred. There are no CDC records of known species at risk.

Zoning

The entire park (49 hectares) is zoned Intensive Recreation to provide vehicle-accessible rest stop and lake-oriented recreation opportunities.
