

VEHICLE ACCESS IN LAC DU BOIS GRASSLANDS PROVINCIAL PARK

Motorized vehicles are allowed in the designated All Terrain Vehicle Area between the park and Batchelor Heights (see hatched area on map). Within the park, motorized vehicles are only allowed on the roads shown in black on the attached map. Note the following information for each of these roads:

- Lac du Bois Road - busy public road.
- Red Lake Road - busy public road, also called the Tranquille-Criss Creek Forest Service Road.
- Long Lake Road – rough road, closed from late December until it hardens up in the spring.
- Frederick Road – public road through Dewdrop Flats.
- Red Plateau Forest Service Road – logging road.
- McQueen Lake to Dairy Creek – rough sections, outside the park boundary.
- Pruden Pass Road – Dead end, used by private land owners only.

All other roads and tracks in the park are closed to motor vehicles unless permission is obtained from BC Parks (ranchers are allowed access for managing cattle).
