PURPOSE STATEMENT July 2003

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Meridian Road (Vanderhoof) Ecological Reserve Purpose Statement

The Meridian Road (Vanderhoof) Ecological Reserve is located 40 km south of Vanderhoof. The ecological reserve is 262 ha in size, and preserves a sample of mature Engelmann Spruce – Subalpine Fir forest representative of uplands within the Nechako Plateau. Meridian Road marks the northeast boundary of the ecological reserve.

The ecological reserve has little relief, but is located at the eastern edge of the Nulki Hills, a rolling upland within the Nechako Plateau. Meandering streams flow across the ecological reserve in shallow valleys.

This ecological reserve is almost entirely covered with dense stands of mature conifers. Boggy sites, mostly in the northern corner, comprise less than 5% of its total area. The forest communities are characteristic of lower elevations in the Engelmann Spruce – Subalpine Fir Zone, near its contact with the Sub-Boreal Spruce Zone.

Primary Role

The primary role of Meridian Road (Vanderhoof) Ecological Reserve is to preserve a sample of mature Engelmann Spruce – Subalpine Fir forest representative of uplands within the Nechako Plateau.
