MORDEN COLLIERY HISTORIC PROVINCIAL PARK Purpose Statement and Zoning Plan

Primary Role

The **primary** role of Morden Colliery Historic Provincial Park is to protect and preserve remnants (coal tipple and other mining artifacts) of the Nanaimo Region's coal mining history. Most of the park's natural vegetation is second growth and the open areas are disturbed from previous mining activities. An open dirt parking area allows visitors access to view the old concrete coal tipple, the only remaining coal tipple found on Vancouver Island.

Secondary Role

The **secondary** role of Morden Colliery Historic Provincial Park is to offer opportunities for trail users, including hikers and cyclists, as a regional trail passes through the park along a historic railway right-of-way.
