## **Mount Elphinstone Provincial Park Purpose Statement and Zoning Plan**

### **Primary Role**

The **primary role** of Mount Elphinstone Provincial Park is to protect a mixed old growth and second growth forest and the very diverse and rich fungi populations associated with the forest. The park protects a relatively undisturbed lower elevation forest in three separate sites and provides the biogeoclimatic conditions appropriate for extensive fungi populations.

### **Secondary Role**

The **secondary role** is to provide local and regional recreation opportunities for fungi interpretation and viewing, hiking and mountain biking.
