MOUNT TINSDALE ECOLOGICAL RESERVE Purpose Statement

Primary Role

The **primary** role of Mount Tinsdale Ecological Reserve is to protect representative plant communities in the Alpine Tundra and ESSF biogeoclimatic zones.

CONSERVATION Representation ecosection Contributes to the representation of the poorly represented Bowron Valley Ecosection (BOV). Currently 3.18% of the BOV is protected, primarily within Bowron Lake Park. Although the second largest contributor to the representation of the BOV, the ecological reserve contributes only 1.89% of the overall protected area representation of this ecosection. Other small protected areas include Wendle Class C Park and Barkerville. Both the AT and ESSFwc3 are very well protected within biogeoclimatic the protected areas system. 22.46% of the AT in the subzone/variant province is protected, and 32.69% of the ESSFwc3 is protected primarily within Kakwa, Cariboo Mountains and Wells Gray parks. Mount Tinsdale's contribution is negligible (only 0.04% of overall protected area representation of this subzone). **Special Feature** Undisturbed subalpine ESSF parkland and alpine ecosystems Rare/Endangered Values Red-listed mountain caribou (likely the Barkerville herd of approximately 30 animals).
