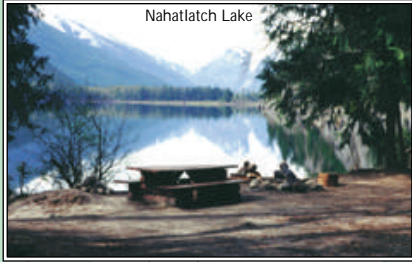




Nahatlatch Provincial Park



Nahatlatch Provincial Park was established in 1999 and protects a representative sample of a relatively undisturbed Coast Mountain drainage. Numerous creeks draining rugged rock and ice ridges at higher elevations flow into one relatively straight and one curved subalpine glacial trough. Frequent slides and avalanches have resulted in a patchwork of old growth subalpine forest stands along the valley bottom.

First Nations traditional use has occurred in this area for thousands of years. Wildlife abounds in this scenic valley. Please take care not to disturb the wildlife and the supporting habitat. Nahatlatch Provincial Park provides excellent opportunities for quality camping, hiking, swimming and wildlife viewing.

Please practice "no trace" camping and day use. Watch for logging trucks. Use caution when canoeing or kayaking.
