TEN MILE LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK Purpose Statement and Zoning Plan

Primary Role

The **primary** role of Ten Mile Lake Provincial Park is to provide a vehicle accessed camping area and lakeside recreation and nature appreciation opportunities accessible from the Highway 97 corridor or from the community of Quesnel, including swimming, nature appreciation, cross-country skiing, and boat access to Ten Mile Lake.

Secondary Role

The **secondary** role of the park is to protect a small forested area (SBSdw1), which provides habitat in a developed, near-urban area.


Zoning

The area around the day use area, beach and campgrounds, as well as the former Doody property, is zoned *Intensive Recreation* (24% of the park). The remaining areas of the park (76%) are zoned *Natural Environment*.
