Whiskers Point Provincial Park is a welcoming stop-over campground as well as a relaxing destination for an extended family retreat.

Located 130 kilometres north of Prince George on Hwy 97, this area was once admired by famous explorer Simon Fraser who established Fort McLeod on behalf of the North West Trading Company in 1805. Fort McLeod, just 10 kilometres north of here, was the first trading post established west of the Rocky Mountains.

The park lies on a peninsula reaching into historic McLeod Lake, creating seclusion and a sheltered southern exposure. Campers marvel at the magnificent sunsets over the lake.



No lifeguards are on duty. Children should be watched at all times .

To avoid problems with nuisance animals such as bears, lock your food in your vehicle at night. Use the garbage containers provided to keep a clean campsite. Never feed or approach bears.

Boaters are cautioned to keep a close eye on the weather as McLeod Lake is subject to sudden, heavy winds which can transform the lake surface into dangerous whitecaps. When proceeding along the lake watch for periodic shallow spots.
